The ipads should be rotated so the sound buttons are visible when the ipad is closed. Then the back camera will be accessible.

When returning the ipads to the storage case, the home button should be closest to the top so they can be easily recharged.

When using:

Use the home button to return to the home screen. Double click the home button to see all of the apps that are currently open. At the end of your time, double click then slide each app up on the screen to close it.



Speaking folder:

• Learn English: All levels

Use Speak or Sentences to listen to the sentence until you are ready to repeat it. Then touch the record button to speak and again to stop. You can see color coded results of how you speak compared to the model. It is not perfect, but helps students self-correct.

• Phonics Studio: Low levels

Pick the letter of the alphabet to practice. Decide if you want practice as initial sound, medial, final, or as blends. Click what you choose then Let's Go.
